

5 Proven Strategies to Help Students Ace the OSSLT

The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) is a significant milestone in every Ontario high school student's academic journey. For many students, it can feel overwhelming, but with the right preparation and support, success is well within reach. Teachers play a crucial role in equipping students with the skills and strategies needed to excel.

1. Prioritize Reading Comprehension Skills

This helps reinforce their understanding and encourages them to think critically about what they've read. You could also use paired or group discussions to help students articulate their thoughts and gain new perspectives.

Practical Example:

Assign a short news article, ask students to underline unfamiliar vocabulary, summarize the main idea in two sentences, and discuss their summaries in groups.

2. Teach Writing Structures for Different Formats

Why It Matters:

The OSSLT evaluates a student's ability to write in various formats, such as opinion pieces, summaries, and news reports. Understanding the structure of each format is essential, as this helps students organize

their thoughts clearly and logically. Often, students lose marks not because of weak content but because of a lack of structure in their writing.

How to Implement:

Focus on Specific Formats: Dedicate lessons to teaching the formats tested in the OSSLT—opinion essays, news reports, and summaries. Break down the specific structure of each format. For example, in a news report, students need to focus on providing the "who, what, when, where, why, and how" in the first paragraph.



Use Graphic Organizers: Help students visualize their writing by using graphic organizers like essay outlines, storyboards, or concept maps. This strategy can guide them through each section of their writing and ensure their work is coherent.

Daily Writing Prompts: Introduce short writing prompts in different formats and ask students to complete them within a set timeframe. This will not only build their writing skills but also boost their confidence in approaching different tasks during the test.

Practical Example:

Provide a simple news story scenario and ask students to write a short news report following the correct format. Later, students can peerreview each other's work, focusing on structure and clarity.


3. Encourage Time Management Skills

Poor time management can lead to rushed answers and incomplete sections, which can dramatically lower their scores. By teaching students effective time management techniques, you help them feel more in control on test day.

How to Implement:

- Simulate Test Conditions: Give your students practice tests under real OSSLT conditions. Time each section, and help students gauge how long they should spend on each part of the test.
- Teach Skimming and Scanning Techniques:
 Teach students how to quickly skim texts for important information and scan for specific details. These skills can be especially helpful when answering multiple-choice questions or summarizing information in the test.



Create a Time Budget: Help students develop a "time budget" for the
test. Encourage them to allocate specific amounts of time to each
section and to move on if they are stuck on a particular question.
 Remind them to leave time at the end for reviewing their answers.

Practical Example:

Have students practice reading a passage and answering comprehension questions within a five-minute window. Afterward, discuss their strategies for completing the task on time and areas where they felt rushed.

4. Utilize Technology and Resources

Why It Matters:
